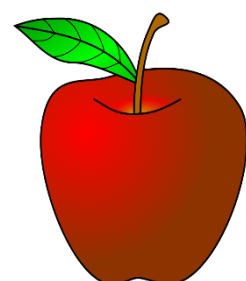
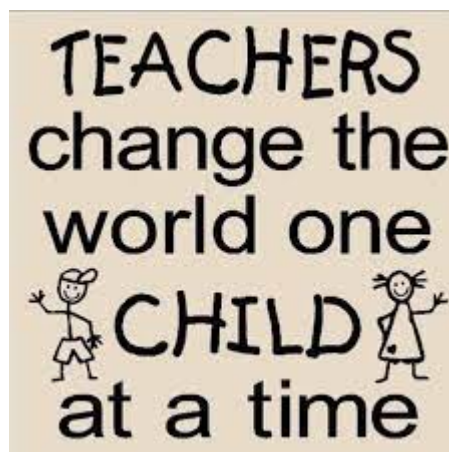
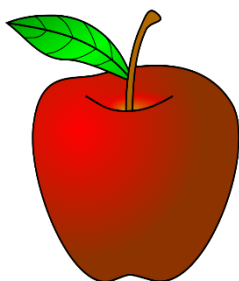
Dear Parents,

BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT



Class Dojo is a tool I will use to encourage positive behaviors. Each scholar will be assigned a monster on **CLASS DOJO**. Scholars will have the opportunity to earn points based on their **participation, helping others, being on task, persistence, and teamwork.**

REWARDS

****Students will be assessed on a weekly basis through unit reading tests. All tests will be announced in our weekly newsletter.**



WRITING

Every day, scholars will be given a topic or prompt to reflect on and write about in their classroom journal. Scholars will write a variety of pieces throughout the year that include narrative, informative, and opinion. Scholars will be graded on these pieces of writing; however, it is up to the teacher's discretion on whether they will be counted as a classwork, homework, quiz, or test grade; as the ultimate goal is to foster lifelong creative writers.

SOCIAL STUDIES



This year, social studies will be taught through the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grade curriculum. Scholars in 3rd grade will study and research the history of the United States through various sources including online novels, Brain Pop, the SS Weekly Magazine, online news sources, such as Time for Kids, and non-fiction content-based reading passages. Also, scholars will learn geographical locations and map skills. Scholars will be assessed on their knowledge using authentic assessments, such as projects as well as more formal assessments that include online reading comprehension passages.






Reading/Language Arts/Social Studies are weighted as follows:

Tests: 40%
Quizzes: 30%
Classwork: 20%
Homework: 10%

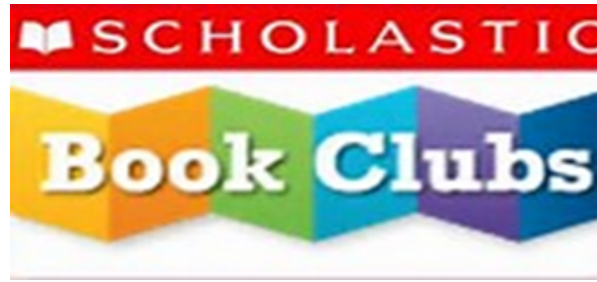

Dear Parents,

The Language Arts department is streamlining our **iReady Grading** scales so that all professors, in the Language Arts department, are grading iReady lessons the same. We will be utilizing the iReady program during our class time, as well as assigning individual lessons for home learning. Our policy and procedures for each component is as follows:

Home Learning:

- iReady will be given a **separate homework grade weekly**. The recommended time frame from Miami-Dade County Public Schools is 45 minutes for a scholar on grade level. Any additional minutes required will be supplemented during class hours.
- The following scale will be used for grading home learning, based on the number of minutes **completed**:

- **45-40 – 100% A**

- **39-34 – 80% B**

- **33-28 – 70% C**

- **27-22 – 60% D**

- **21-16 – 50% F**

- **15-10 – 20% F**

- **9 – 0 – 0% F**

Classwork:

Scholars will have the opportunity to work on their individualized lessons within their Language Arts classes during small group/centers. These minutes may be counted toward their home learning assignment.

Professors may assign, grade level, whole group lessons that each scholar will complete during our class time together. For example, if the comprehension skill of the week is **Main Idea and Key Details**, professors may assign that lesson to the entire class and use the scholars' individual score as a weekly quiz or test grade. Please note that if scholars do not complete their 45 minutes weekly, it will result in a 0 (zero) in the gradebook. Professors will not accept scholars trying to make up their minutes the following week, as it is overwhelming and time consuming to the scholar.

As always, thank you for your continued support in your child's education.
